

America, One Nation Under III

"For it is written, I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and will bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent. Where is the wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the disputer of this world? Hath not God made foolish the wisdom of this world?" (1 Corinthians 1:19-20).

When the nation of Israel was freed from the slavery of Egypt, they were commanded by God to worship Him alone and not the multiple gods of the pagan nations that surrounded them (Exodus). By the close of 1860 there were 246 colleges in America. Harvard's original rule was; "Let every student be plainly instructed and earnestly pressed to consider well, the main end of his life and studies is, to know God and Jesus Christ which is eternal life, (John 17:3), and therefore to lay Christ in the bottom, as the only foundation of all sound knowledge and learning."

Seeing that the Bible was the first textbook that was used in the United States, we cannot deny the fact that the God of the Bible has played a major role in the foundations that were laid down by our Founding Fathers. They knew that it was the God of the Bible who founded this nation. But unfortunately most recently there has been a vast movement to remove the Bible out of the public's grasp including the schools and the government by those scoffers who "believe" that there is no God. Their actions are totally the opposite of the actions of our Founding Fathers. Their "belief" system is driving them to go against everything America stands for and has stood for since it was founded, and also at the same time go against the God who gave them life and holds their breath in His hands.
